#### "You're welcome!"

Our church network exists for two reasons; *to know Jesus* and to *make Jesus known*, all for the glory of God! If you're an ordinary follower of Jesus you've been welcomed into God's family by His extraordinary grace and we want others to know and experience that same grace. People will meet Jesus through His word and through His people – even YOU! So let's be a welcoming church. Here are **seven** ways you can welcome people – starting today!

- 1. "It's great to have you here." It's just that basic. I have heard from numerous church guests who returned because they were simply told this.
- 2. "Let me help you with that." If you see someone struggling with umbrellas, young children, nappy bags, and other items, a gesture to hold something for them is hugely positive. [Of course, this comment is appropriate for member to member as well!]
- 3. "Please take my seat." I know, fancy being willing to give up your seat! It's just the kind thing to do.
- 4. "Here's my email address/phone number, let me know if I can help in any way." This comment must be used with discretion, but it can be a hugely positive message to a guest.
- 5. "Can I show you where you need to go?" Even in smaller churches, guests will not know where to find the crèche, bathrooms, morning tea, and Info Central. You can usually tell when a guest does not know where he or she is to go.
- 6. "Let me introduce you to \_\_\_\_\_." A church member may have the opportunity to introduce the guest to the pastor, other church staff, and other members of the church. Church is about people after all!

7. "Would you like to join us for lunch?" The burden of this should not be great but the

impact huge. Keep the food simple and connection profound!


